



Transkei Day Tour



A 4x4 cultural adventure that will take us through the hills and valleys of the former Transkei, and home to Nelson “Madiba”

Mandela, father of our nation. Cross by **rickety ferry over the Great Kei River**, a historically significant landmark during the frontier wars between the British and the Xhosas.

Passing by the **pools of prophecy** the history of **Nongquwase** and the “cattle killings” will be told.

This Tragic epic in Xhosa history could have been a turning point for a very different South Africa. Throughout the day you will cover the **cultural, historical, political and social developments** of the former Transkei region and the Gcaleka people.

Travelling along sledging paths we will head into the Qolora Basin and through “**The Gates**”, widely recognised for its exceptional biodiversity and gentle mix of several of the South African biomes. Here the opportunities for **kloofing** [jumping off cliffs into the river], swimming and bird watching are much enjoyed.


In the rural Xhosa **village of Ngingxolo** you will be entertained and enlightened by a community proud of its culture and strong in its traditions.

The village is set overlooking the Eastern

Cape’s grassland biome and is home to 2500 people. Under the leadership of Mama Tofu you will explore the homesteads of residents and learn of the roles and responsibilities of family members, initiation practices and the new challenges faced by today’s social demands.

Dinner offers the opportunity to enjoy traditional food which is prepared on open fires in this enchanting village. Bidding fare well to our hosts, you will be transported back to your accommodation in East London.

Sleep the night with your hosts in their homes – these are traditional Xhosa rondavels and it is an authentic village. Electricity is erratic, there is no running water and although facilities are basic, the village prides itself on high standards of cleanliness and ensure a comfortable stay.

Day 2: Back road mountain biking

Our guides will meet you after your village breakfast and prepare you for a scenic mountain bike trail that follows back roads through the hills, valleys and villages of the Southern Wild Coast.

You will arrive back at Buccaneers just before lunch where the tour ends.
